### WHAT'S PLANNED FOR YOUNG & FREE?

Welcome to Young & Free Camp! We have some AMAZING things planned for this year and we're excited you are planning to join us! Just like last year, some things will be the same, while others will be different. For instance, we will gather together for worship in the morning chapel, but after worship, we will go into our church groups for God time, (Different) and students from MNU will lead us in communal worship (Same). Of course, there will be the usual things too: lots of games, breakout sessions, and much more!

### WHO'S IT FOR?

Young & Free is for all Jr. High and Sr. High students, recent 2022 graduates. We understand that different local churches have different grade levels that they include in youth ministry. Some begin with 6<sup>th</sup> graders and some with 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> graders. We defer to the local church guidelines for participation in Young & Free but request that students at least be going into 6<sup>th</sup> grade for the 2022-2023 school year.

### WHAT'S MY COST?

**COST:**        \$250 Regular Registration  
                  \$275 Late Registration

Registration online will include a \$50 ***non-refundable*** deposit. Once that deposit is paid, you are registered! Final payment will be made AT REGISTRATION with a church check for the remaining amount for each student. This amount will be communicated to you and your church leadership.

We are also providing a sibling discount again. Each consecutive sibling living in the same home will be given a \$15 discount. (ie. Student 1: \$225, Sibling 1: \$210, Sibling 2: \$195, etc.) There will be no discount codes provided. The price change will be entered manually by Y&F staff to avoid confusion.

**PLEASE NOTE: There will not be any walk-up registrations. Registration will officially close on June 5th. At this time, the online registration form will become disabled and only re-enabled by the camp director. Late registrations are intended for extenuating circumstances and are NOT guaranteed.**

**WHAT TO BRING:** sleeping bag, toothbrush and toothpaste, soap and shampoo, deodorant, sunscreen, a towel, a flashlight, hammock, fishing pole, hiking shoes, money for snacks, a notebook, pen and pencil, and, of course, your Bible!

### DRESSCODE:

We will be assembling a dress code team that will be working alongside the camp director throughout the week to make sure that everyone (boys & girls) are following dress code guidelines. We are hoping and praying for no issues but if any issues do arise those issues will be addressed to the camp director or a member of the dress code team. Group leaders are asked to review the dress code with all campers and their parents before leaving for camp. We ask that group leaders and adult sponsors lead by example in following the dress code.

### CLOTHING:

Casual clothes: Campers and staff are expected to wear appropriate clothing. We ask that midriffs be covered and undergarments not be exposed. No clothing or t-shirts will be allowed that send inappropriate messages, in written or picture form, that are profane or demeaning, promote illegal, violent, or gang activity, or promote the use of alcohol or drugs.

Clothing that will be considered inappropriate includes spaghetti straps, strapless tops, short shorts, no midriffs, pants that sag, or t-shirts with sides cut out.

- **SWIMWEAR:**

- Guys must wear sturdy trunks... no shorts, cut-off pants, or speedos. Shirts must be worn to and from Swimming areas.
- Girls must wear sturdy modestly cut one or two-piece suits. T-Shirts are not required, but no string, thong, or crochet bikinis are allowed.
- Both: Swimsuits may be worn ONLY during swimming.

**GAMES:** There will be all kinds of games to participate in during the day and late at night. Any specific “need to bring” list will be provided as soon as possible to all participants before your arrival at Young & Free. The safety of our students is a major priority in the planning of our games, but we can guarantee they will be a blast!
